Greetings from the West,

I hope this article finds everyone well. As we are approaching the end of the year, I would like to concentrate on a few fundamentals to help in our recruiting efforts. It is human nature; most people give up too soon. Without good follow-up, it is like harvesting a big crop only to let it spoil out on the field.

If you are following up with potential brothers by phone, please use a follow up schedule and please leverage email. It is interesting to realize that most people are only focused on closing hot leads. At first glance this seems to make sense focus on your best opportunities, right? The problem with this approach is that it leaves a lot of good leads, that just need more time and nurturing to wither on the vine.

Calling three times is 68% more effective than calling once and calling six times is 94% better than calling once. As you can see, the odds of making contact go up with each additional call, but there is a max, after 6 calls, back off a bit, as once you reach that threshold, you are not likely to achieve the goal. Remember, the goal is to stay in front in a way that creates value rather than annoyance. It's part art, part science, here are some tips:

Tip #1: Get commitment for the follow up. As an example, you can say something like: "I'll be glad to help you write up the petition and turn it in for you next week. Tip #2: Build equity and be remembered. As an example, handwrite a message on a small thank you card that simply says, "John, thank you for taking the time to speak with me today

Brothers, for us to achieve our goal, it is vital to have a superb follow up strategy and tactic, so that you can make the most of the moment.

In summary, having a plan will separate you from the other Valleys seeking the same prospects as you. This gives you a distinctive edge. Make the most of your follow up calls or meetings and watch our membership grow!


