Greetings Brothers and welcome to February!

Now that the holidays are over and the year is in full swing it's time to start thinking about this year's reunion classes... what does it take to hold great reunion classes? Candidates! So I ask you, when was the last time you visited your Blue Lodge? If you had to think about the answer to this question, it's probably been too long. Do you have Scottish Rite applications? If not please pick some up. Go visit your blue lodge and talk to your brothers about the Scottish Rite, and help make this year a great one for YOUR Scottish Rite!

Now for this month's Masonic tidbits; February 9, 1909 Harry S. Truman received his 1st degree in Belton Lodge #450 Missouri 36 years prior to becoming our 33rd President. On February 18, 1909, our 27th President, William Howard Taft, received his 1st degree in Kilwinning Lodge #356 Cincinnati, OH. On February 23rd 1887 Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, the creator of Sherlock Holmes, received his 2nd degree. And finally on February 11th 1988 the Grand Master of Washington D.C. met with then President Ronald Reagan and presented him with a "Certificate of Honor" which said that his life was a testament to his firm belief in the three principal tenants of freemasonry, brotherly love, relief and truth. This certificate also stated that his service to the public has broadened the applications of temperance, fortitude, prudence, and justice to the benefit of all mankind. Wise Master

The 'Brethren of the Rosy Cross' had begun in Europe as a sect of philosophers who claimed knowledge of all the sciences, chiefly medicine, and many secrets of the universe. It is said the order began in remote antiquity in Egypt and continued in existence through periods of deliberate secrecy. Its teachings combine elements of Egyptian Hermetism, Gnosticism, Jewish Cabalism, and other occult beliefs and practices.

Many scholars believe that the order actually developed in Germany after the publication of the Fama Fraternitatis and the Confessio Rosae Crucis (1614, 1615; The Fame and Confession of the Fraternity of the Rosy Cross; trans. 1652).

The original secrets of the Rose Croix comes from an unpublished manuscript in the British Museum entitled 'A Treatise of the Rosie-Crucian Secrets' and is thus.

The outer and inner mind without God's light you cannot find. Only the Spirit alone knows, reason in flesh is blind.

- I. GOD: God is free everywhere. Within and without all Creatures. Time measure of Nature. The Angel with six wings.
- II. FATHER: God is the Alpha and Omega. The Beginning and the End. Time measure of the Law. Lion with six wings.
- III. SON: God is the first and the last. Time of the Evangelium. Ox with six wings.
- IV. HOLY GHOST: And there is no God. But the one God. Time of fulfillment. Eagle with six wings.

And out of the throne preceded lightning and thundering and voices: and there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God. And before the throne there was a sea of glass like unto crystal: and in the midst of the throne, and round about the throne, were four beasts full of eyes before and behind. And the first beast was like a lion, and the second beast like a calf, and the third beast had a face as a man, and the fourth beast was like a flying eagle. And the four beasts had each of them six wings about him; and they were full of eyes within: and they rest not day and night, saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come. (Revelation 4:8)

Departed Brother



Few of us probably took note last December 16th when Astronaut and Senator John H. Glenn passed away that he was not only a Freemason but a 33° Scottish Rite Mason. Take a moment now to remember our recently departed Brother.

The Illustrious John Glenn 33° originally petitioned his hometown lodge, Concord Lodge No. 688 of New Concord, Ohio, in 1964. He was elected to receive the Degrees of Masonry; however, his increasingly busy life made it impossible for him to receive those degrees at the time. Even so, he continued to desire admission in Concord Lodge. Fourteen years later, on August 19, 1978, John Glenn was finally able to finish what he had begun in 1964. At

the Chillicothe High School gymnasium with hundreds of Master Masons present, John Glenn received the Master Mason degree in a special meeting. After the Master of Scioto Lodge No. 6 opened the lodge, he turned the meeting over to Grand Master of Ohio, Jerry C. Rasor, who in turn opened the Grand Lodge of Ohio who conferred the degrees.

On April 11, 1997, Brother Glenn received further light in Masonry in the Valley of Cincinnati when he received the Scottish Rite Degrees. He later received the highest Masonic honor on September 10, 1998, when he was conferred with the 33° of Masonry. Several of his friends from Washington, D.C., attended the event. Senate colleagues, Brothers Charles Grassley and Conrad Burns, were present as was a former Ohio congressman Brother Clarence Brown, Jr. of the Valley of Dayton. It might be interesting to note that there are two topics deemed inappropriate to discuss in a lodge of Freemasons because they are topics that divide men instead of uniting them—religion and politics. This ideal is obviously something John Glenn very much believes in. The three friends that joined Brother Glenn at the conferral of his 33° were Republicans. John Glenn has been a lifelong Democrat. ~TEC


