How wonderful it was to receive the most recent edition of Collectanea which featured The William H. Peckham 'Cerneau' Scottish Rite  $(10^{\circ}\text{-}13^{\circ})$ . This is issued by the Grand College of Rites, a Masonic organization dedicated to presenting "some of the most famous, interesting, disused Masonic and quasi-Masonic Orders" for the purpose of masonic study [Volume 24, Part 3]. Plug – Membership is open to Master Masons in good standing for a nominal fee.

The *Cerneau* ritual (now defunct) competed against the other Scottish Rite Supreme Councils. Controversy aside, what an interesting opportunity to promote echoing beyond the grave. From the Sanctum Sanctorum the reader being reminded the Lord's requirements of an everlasting life; and in such beautiful degree, the great danger undeterred by the virtuous and zealous Brother who prevails and progresses onward to Perfection.

From the Lodge of Perfection motto: Virtue unites what death cannot separate. Pride of great membership, while convenient, potentially intoxicates power neglecting the true purpose of Freemasonry.

"....By now you may be asking, "But how can I get active in the day-to-day work of my Scottish Rite Valley?" Lots of ways! The first and most obvious way is to attend the events

and activities of your Valley. This constitutes a broad range from stated meetings, dinners, charitable functions, and degree work. There is usually some activity or function that interests you, and if one is lacking—suggest it!

Many Valleys also have chapters of the Knights of St. Andrew, a body of 32° Masons with the mission of assisting the Valley in various ways. If your Valley doesn't have a Knights of St. Andrew chapter, you could start one.

However, whether you join the Knights of St. Andrew or not, your Valley has opportunities for every member to contribute in ways their cabletow allows. Maybe you can use your accounting skills to help audit the books, perhaps you can run the lighting or sound at the next Reunion, use your drama training to participate in the degree, cook or serve dinner at the next social function, or raise money for one of many charitable endeavors. But whatever you choose to do, remember the Royal Secret that you learned in the 32nd Degree and the teaching of the 24-inch gauge. There are some who think that the True Lost Word of Masonry is the word "No." Masons tend to be eager to serve, and this willingness can sometimes lead to overburdening ourselves. ### Hello from the OC Childhood Language Center.

This month was another busy one, as we continued to have a positive impact on the children we serve. We are blessed to have 61 kids enrolled in our program and because of your kindness, we provided 52 hours of speech therapy. It is great to see first-hand how our Chapman supervisors and clinicians are able to transform the lives of our children

Congratulations to our team for a job well done, especially to you, our financial supporters for making this possible at the Center.

#### Student of the Month

Joseph started speech and language therapy in October 2015. Joseph's parents and pediatrician became concerned when he was not using words. Joseph was very shy, and his first language goals were to imitate animal and car sounds. He then began to use 5 functional words to complete sentences all the way to telling stories. His speech progressed from using consonants at the end of his words; producing (k) and (g) sounds in conversation. He also exhibited "stuttering like" behaviors for 6 to 8 months. Now, fast forward to March 2018, Joseph is explaining to his therapist that a boy can be a brother. Because of his cooperative behavior and good attitude to improve his speech, he has been rewarded with cars from the treasure box. Joseph explained that he will need to build more shelves for his cars and he likes them very much. His mother, Susan stated it was very important to her that Joseph received early intervention. Joseph is a beautiful example of why our Center is in a win/win situation, the graduate interns were able to diagnose and treat speech, language and fluency skills at no charge and Joseph will be able to confidently stride into prekindergarten ready to compete with his peers. Our gratitude to the family for letting us work with Joseph and our thanks to you, our supporters, for proving the financial assistance to make this miracle happen.

#### **Graduations!**

We are so excited to celebrate the "graduation" of one of our young clients this month.

It is a very proud moment for these families, and for everyone at the Language Center.

His name is C. McCullen. He started with us in June of 2017. He has consistently attended therapy to improve his expressive language skills.



When he began at the

CLC he had only a few words that he did not use regularly. Now he has an expanded vocabulary and uses 3 to 4 word sentences. C. has met all his goals and is now age appropriate with all of his skills.


