Hello from the OC Childhood Language Center.

The multiple rainstorms this month have not stopped families at the Orange County CLC. There have been no cancellations due to the weather, which proves we must be doing something right. The center is operating with four supervisors, and up to four student clinicians a day and we have a full schedule of 60 families. As children graduate and complete their services at the CLC, we can fill these vacant slots as we continue to evaluate about 4 families a week. The CLC is off to a flourishing start for 2019, just like all the trees and plants with all the much-needed rain.

This semester has brought an interesting phenomenon – we have three sets of twins who are enrolled for services at the CLC and we are in the process of evaluating a fourth set of twins.

Fortunately we have an expert on staff since one of our Chapman Supervisors has twins at home.

Twins and multiple birth pregnancies have a higher risk for premature births and complications at birth and



may be at risk for speech and language delays.

These families are very pleased to have found the CLC as we can provide the necessary services to help these children become strong communicators. For us it

is double the fun, double the learning and double the cuteness!

The Language Center could use someone who can volunteer on short notice to help us fix things around the center. Recently we had a door knob, a toilet
