225 Years of Light: The Scottish Rite Southern Jurisdiction Marks a Historic Milestone

On May 31, 2026, the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction, USA, marked 225 years since its founding – a milestone celebrated not just at its spiritual home in Charleston, South Carolina, but in Scottish Rite Temples across the country, where brothers gathered to watch the festivities broadcast live from the place where it all began.

The Scottish Rite formally came into existence in the United States on May 31, 1801, when Colonel John Mitchell and Reverend Dr. Frederick Dalcho met in Charleston, South Carolina. It convened the Supreme Council, 33° of Freemasonry. That historic gathering took place at Shepherd's Tavern, at the corner of Broad and Church Streets. This location had already witnessed the founding of Freemasonry in South Carolina nearly half a century earlier. The men present that day became known as "The Eleven Gentlemen of Charleston," and the institution they created would grow into one of the most enduring fraternal organizations in American history.

The Supreme Council holds the distinction of being the first Scottish Rite Supreme Council established in the United States – the mother council from which the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction derived its own charter in 1813. Today, its official title runs to an impressive length: "The Supreme Council (Mother Council of the World) of the Inspectors General, Knights Commander of the House of the Temple of Solomon of the Thirty-third Degree of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America." In practice, it is simply known as the Mother Council of the World.

Headquartered at the House of the Temple in Washington, D.C., the Council exercises jurisdiction over 35 states, the District of Columbia, and designated overseas areas, overseeing local bodies known as Valleys and Orients. The Scottish Rite extends the Masonic journey beyond the foundational three degrees of the Blue Lodge, conferring degrees from the 4th through the 32nd, with the honorary 33rd degree awarded for exceptional service to the Rite or to humanity.

The anniversary celebration on May 31 drew Brothers together at local Valleys coast to coast. Temples like the Austin Scottish Rite opened their doors, gathering members to watch the Supreme Council conduct the business of commemorating 225 years of Scottish Rite history, broadcast live from Charleston. It was a fitting tribute – the Mother Council visible in real time to the thousands of brothers whose Masonic lives it has shaped, a living reminder that 225 years on, the light of the Scottish Rite burns as brightly as ever.
