Personal Representative's Message



Greetings my friends and Brothers! I hope this message finds you and yours in good health and spirits. You know, there is an old saying that March comes in like a bear and goes out like a lamb. I don't think March got the message this year.

Your Valley was well represented at the Supreme Council Leadership Conference held in San Diego last month. There were several classes on managing the affairs of the Valley as well as a new class for Fellows of the Supreme Council. Attending the Conference were Frankie Rosario 32°, Andrew Todd 32°, Mike Selix 32°, James Segerstrom 32°, Daniel Willerton 32°, Robert W McNamara 32° Knight Commander of the Court of Honor and Richard B Wood 33° Inspector General Honorary. One of the highlights of any of these Conferences is the opportunity to hear from and even visit with the Supreme Grand Commander, Ron Seale, 33° Sovereign Grand Inspector General. Illustrious Seale is a great speaker and a wealth of knowledge about Scottish Rite Masonry; just ask Daniel! My thanks to these Brothers for taking the time away from their normal activities to learn more about how to serve our fraternity.

April is a month of celebration for many around the world. In particular, our Jewish Brothers celebrate Passover. The **Passover Seder** (Hebrew: סדר *seder*, "order, arrangement"; Yiddish: *Seyder*) is a Jewish ritual feast that marks the beginning of the Jewish holiday of Passover. It is conducted on the evenings of the 14th day of Nisan in the Hebrew calendar, and on the 15th by traditionally observant Jews living outside Israel. This corresponds to late March or April in the Gregorian calendar.

The Seder is a ritual performed by a community or by multiple generations of a family, involving a retelling of the story of the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt. This story is in the Book of Exodus (*Shemot*) in the Hebrew Bible. The Seder itself is based on the Biblical verse commanding Jews to retell the story of the Exodus from Egypt: "You shall tell your child on that day, saying, 'It is because of what the LORD did for me when I came out of Egypt.'" (Exodus 13:8) Traditionally, families and friends gather in the evening to read the text of the Haggadah, an ancient work derived from the Mishnah. The Haggadah contains the narrative of the Israelite exodus from Egypt, special blessings and rituals, commentaries from the Talmud, and special Passover songs.

Seder customs include drinking four cups of wine, eating matzah, partaking of symbolic foods placed on the Passover Seder Plate, and reclining in celebration of freedom. The Seder is performed in much the same way by Jews all over the world.

Personal Rep Continued

Our Brothers of the Christian faith celebrate this season as the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. Easter (Old English: *Ēostre*; Greek: Πάσχα, *Paskha*; Aramaic: קִפּוּס *Pasha*; from Hebrew: פֶּסַח *Pesah*) is the central feast in the Christian liturgical year. According to the Canonical gospels, Jesus rose from the dead on the third day after his crucifixion. His resurrection is celebrated on Easter Day or Easter Sunday (also Resurrection Day or Resurrection Sunday). The chronology of his death and resurrection is variously interpreted to have occurred between AD 26 and 36.

Easter marks the end of Lent, a forty-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance. The last week of the Lent is called Holy Week, and it contains Good Friday, commemorating the crucifixion and death of Jesus. Easter is followed by a fifty-day period called Eastertide or the Easter Season, ending with Pentecost Sunday.

Easter is a moveable feast, meaning it is not fixed in relation to the civil calendar. The First Council of Nicaea (325) established the date of Easter as the first Sunday after the full moon (the Paschal Full Moon) following the northern hemisphere's vernal equinox. Ecclesiastically, the equinox is reckoned to be on March 21 (even though the equinox occurs, astronomically speaking, on March 20 in most years), and the "Full Moon" is not necessarily the astronomically correct date. The date of Easter therefore varies between March 22 and April 25. Eastern Christianity bases its calculations on the Julian Calendar whose March 21 corresponds, during the 21st century, to April 3 in the Gregorian Calendar, in which calendar their celebration of Easter therefore varies between April 4 and May 8.

Easter is linked to the Jewish Passover by much of its symbolism, as well as by its position in the calendar. In many languages, the words for "Easter" and "Passover" are etymologically related or homonymous.

Easter customs vary across the Christian world, but decorating Easter eggs is a common motif. In the Western world, customs such as egg hunting and the Easter Bunny extend from the domain of church, and often have a secular character.

I owe a special thanks and recognition to Wikipedia for the information provided above. Whatever your faith may be, I hope you will join all your Masonic Brothers and Family in bringing the hope of peace to fruition.

How to Keep Brothers Interested and Engaged

A recent Scottish Rite Conference addressed this very question. Apparently a survey was conducted across the Southern Jurisdiction of the Scottish Rite. Its' findings were not surprising. The members did not really feel that they were accepted or that they belonged and they were not getting the Masonic Education that they desired. Coming to Stated Meetings and viewing the five required degrees twice a year were not enough. I would like to address the education.

There are two ways that we are trying to address this situation. The first is the brief presentations at the Stated Meeting dinner. We have two different versions. The first is the 3-5-7 minute short talks given by three different brothers on a subject of interest to our dinner participants and the second is a brief description given by Jack Slagle, 32° KCCH, on one of our 29 degrees. This doesn't get information to those who are unable to come to our meetings.

The second is the Master Craftsman I and II program. This can be done on your own or you can come to our Master Craftsman Class on the last Tuesday of the month in the Oasis Room at the Scottish Rite Center. There we go over discuss certain lessons and complete at least one per night. For those that have a conflict with Tuesdays, another time can be arranged. If you have a desire to learn the history of the Scottish Rite, philosophy and ritualism of Freemasonry, consider joining our Master Craftsman Study Group. John Rider, 32° KCCH and Bob McNamara, 32° KCCH are co-chairing the group. The cost is \$43 and includes Arturo de Hoyos' incomparable resource: The Scottish Rite Ritual Monitor and Guide.

Consider the Easter Lilly

Brethren,

In the second degree we learn that the chapters resting on top of the pillars were ornamented with a representation of network, lily-work, and pomegranates and are said to denote Unity, Peace, and Plenty. Let us examine the lessons of the lily a little closer:

The lily of the field has been held up to us as a symbol of truth and peace, to remind man that God is always with us. Of it has been said; "It toils not, neither does it spin." Why not? Because its perfection lies in the intangible secret of, "The Father and I are one," or "The Law which gave me existence will, if obeyed, vouchsafe my well-being." It knows, symbolically speaking, before bursting its covering of earth, that by adjusting itself to the conditions of darkness and silence for a time this very period of rest will cause it to generate a force with which to pierce a wall of great thickness – the tomb under which it lies buried – and lift its head into the brightness of the sunshine. By this theme we learn to wait a time with patience in order that we may burst through the tomb of ignorance and truly understand the lessons presented to us in the Sublime Degree.

But this is not the whole story of the lily. The lily obeys every Law of Nature without question because *it is true to its own nature*; it cannot do otherwise – lacking free will. It does neither toil nor spin, it is true, but neither does it ask anything of man other than not to be interfered with by man. On the other hand, it *gives* everything without recompense: its beauty, its encouragement to the weary and sorrowful. It offers itself as a lesson of the generosity of the God who created it. It spins not, nor does it toil, but it gives and will continue to give until its life span has ended.

The Easter lily is given to us as a reminder of the legend of Hiram and the life of Jesus. That we may lay to rest the fear of death and the worries of man so that we may truly live a life devoted to the great work and as an example of those who would follow in our footsteps. The greatest gift we can learn to give is that of our time for it can never be returned. The torch of Freemasonry has guided many men since time immemorial; the goal of every good Freemason is to leave the light a little brighter while it is under our care.




