Here is your Masonic tidbits for the month: August is an interesting month for Freemasonry; on August 14, 1826 William Morgan obtained the copyright for his book which led to the "Morgan Affair", many scholars still debate the facts behind the event. Many similar books had been published before, however this one caused great excitement, and led to the founding of the Anti-Masonic Party of the 1820s and 1830s. August is also the Month the Most Worshipful George Washington received his Master Mason degree in Fredericksburg Lodge in Virginia on the 4th in 1758. On the 27th of August in 1920 the 29th president of the United States Brother Warren G. Harding was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Marion Lodge #70 in Ohio.



Welcome from the Orange County Childhood Language Center.

Like most schools and universities, the CLC is on a break for the summer. We will resume operations at the end of summer when the traditional school year starts. That is also when the Chapman University graduate students return to their studies and are available to provide therapy for the children. Summer is a great time for family activities and everyone to recharge their learning batteries.

The Orange County Childhood Language is one of 14 Language Centers in the state of California that are governed by the California Scottish Rite Foundation. All 14 Language Centers are focused on providing high quality speech and language therapy to their local families. Each

Language Center is responsible for raising the necessary funds to support



the operations of the Language Center. That means whatever donations are collected by the Orange County CLC are only used to support our Language Center and help the families in Orange County. The Foundation plays an important role in providing administrative support and financial reporting, to all the Language Centers

in the state. Since the Foundation carries out these important duties the Language Centers can remain focused on providing the high-quality therapy needed by our families.

CLC is on track to follow our roadmap and start using digital records in September of 2017.


Brother Willard R. Nelson, 32°


