## Master of Kadosh



Greetings Brethren,

This month I had an opportunity to facilitate a team building exercise with a group of ten IT analysts (a technically strong group of IT big system administrators). The problem our group was facing came in the form of writer's block and overall project burn out. I'll walk you through the experience; contributors were invited to a two-hour working session where the company provided ice cream (to ensure attendance). Formed in a circle around a common table, poetry word tiles were bagged and shared around the group for each person to draw 6 random words from each bag (each pile contains a unique group of nouns, verbs, adjectives, articles, pronouns, etc. to ensure sentences can be created). September (Roman month) (from Latin septem, "seven") was originally the seventh of ten months on the oldest known Roman calendar, with March (Latin Martius) the first month of the year until perhaps as late as 153 BC. After the calendar reform that added January and February to the beginning of the year, September became the ninth month, but retained its name. It had 29 days until the Julian reform, in the last 1st century BC, an extra day was added in honor of the deified Julius Caesar on 4 September. (paraphrased from information on September on Wikipedia)

I want to apologize to the brothers that I was a bit absent in the August, my company sent me to assist with some transitions in our Denver, CO office. I spent 4 days a week every week last month, although I was home the night of our stated meeting, it was also my 13 year wedding anniversary, and being that that was the only day I was home that week I had to spend it with the family. Here are your Masonic Tidbits for the month of September: on September 4, or 5 1820 Brother James K Polk, United States President from 1845-1849, was initiated as an Entered Apprentice Mason in Columbia Lodge #31, Tennessee. On September 20th 1784 the Grand Lodge of England issued a warrant to African Lodge #459. This charter is displayed in the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, and African Lodge #459 is still in existence to this day. On September 10th 1949 Brother Gerald Ford, United States President from 1974-1977 was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason in Malta Lodge #465, Grand Rapids, Michigan. On September 18th 1793 the cornerstone of the United States Capital building, in Washington D.C. was laid in a formal Masonic ceremony, with George Washington personally playing a key role and wearing Masonic regalia.

If you aren't actively supporting this cause or are new to the Orange County Scottish Rite Valley, now is the time to make your investment in our Language Center to help these children and families.



## Feast of Tishri to be Celebrated in September

### Why the Feast of Tishri?

The origins and significance make it the most Scottish Rite of Festivals. No other occasion epitomizes the character and purpose and character and purpose of the Rite more wholly than this historic celebration of the dedication of King Solomon's Temple. To understand the meaning of the feast is to summarize the principle ideals and traditions of our Fraternity.

First of all, we observe the Feast of Tishri because it is an age-old custom and is a sacramental sharing of our fraternal spirit.

Secondly, the rich legendry of King Solomon's Temple dedication, which is celebrated in the Feast of Tishri, is an essential part of the fourteenth degree. Through the symbols of the Temple, we gain enlightenment and we recommit ourselves to building Freemasonry "in the hearts of men and among nations."

Solomon, a king of peace and wisdom, built the Temple. His very name means peace. Thus, in observing the Feast of Tishri, we affirm our dedication to human concord and the brotherhood of all men in a world of peace. As individuals and as Brothers in the Rite, we resolve to build, as Solomon did, through harmony and cooperation, ever seeking peace for all mankind.

The consecration of the Temple must also be observed at the Feast of Tishri, because it teaches the equality and unity of all members of the Rite. It fosters the warm spirit of fraternal fellowship so vital to our Rite. We meet at a common table, express our mutual esteem and so promote that essential bond of cordiality and respect which lightens and share the weight of our Masonic endeavors.




