In fact, during the Cap and Ring Ceremony for newly made Masters of the Royal Secret you are directed to this end. Each new member is given two petitions. One to replace himself and one to grow the Valley. So how do we fulfill this directive?

The most obvious place to find new members is in your Blue Lodge. Do you know which members of your Blue Lodge are already Scottish Rite Masons? Do you admire and respect a member of your Blue Lodge who you think might make a good Scottish Rite Mason? Why not ask them about becoming a member of our Valley? Speak to them about why you joined and how your experience has been. Find out if any of what we do might interest them. Invite them to a Scottish Rite Stated dinner to meet the brethren.

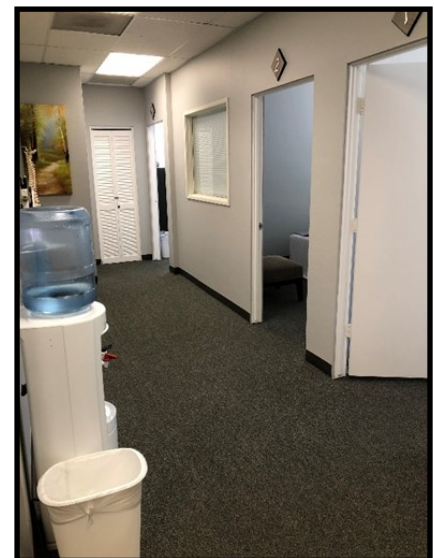
ready for the student clinicians and children to return in the fall.

Masonic Enlightenment

Cedars of Lebanon



From time immemorial, the timbers of the cedar tree have been considered of unusual value because they never decay nor rot. The cedar tree was in ancient times a symbol of eternity, and the cedar wood was sacred among the Hebrews. The Ark of the Covenant for the Tabernacle was made of cedar. For these reasons King Solomon used exclusively cedar timbers in the

building of the Temple.

Since the most excellent cedar forests of the world have always existed in Mt. Lebanon, Solomon formed an alliance with Hiram, King of Tyre, and secured from these forests the necessary timbers for building the Temple. And Solomon sent to Hiram King of Tyre saying, now therefore command thou that they hew me cedar trees out of the Forest of Lebanon, so Hiram gave Solomon cedar trees and fir trees according to all his desire. 1 Kings 5:2-10 - Ps. 92:12 - 1 Kings 5:2-10 - Ezra 3:7

Knight Commander Court of Honor KCCH



The first of the honours of the Court of Honour is the Knight Commander. It was a designation conceived by Grand Commander Albert Pike to honor men of outstanding ability and commitment. A Brother must have been a 32° Mason (a Master of the Royal Secret) for at least 46 months before the Supreme Council can vote on his nomination for the honour. In order to nominate a Brother, the Sovereign Grand Inspector General or the Deputy of the Supreme Council in whose Orient the Brother has his primary membership fills out a form, giving the Brother's name, Masonic and other history, and the reasons for his nomination. He then submits the form in advance of the Biennial Session to the Supreme Council. The vote of the Supreme Council must be unanimous.

Masters of the Royal Secret who distinguish themselves by extraordinary services to humanity and/or the Fraternity may be elected to receive the rank and decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour. The number of those who can be admitted to the Court of Honour at any Session of the Supreme Council is limited in accordance with the rule laid down in the Statutes, which expressly provide that more than twice as many Knight Commanders of the Court of Honour may be elected than the number Knights Commanders elected to receive the Thirty-third Degree.

The designation Knight Commander of the Court of Honour (almost always abbreviated as KCCH) is not a Degree. The KCCH is not conferred upon a Brother; he is invested with it. Neither is it a promise nor hint that the Knight Commander will thereafter receive the Thirty-third Degree.

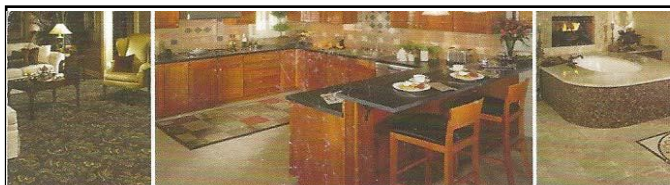
